

Why a Political Manifesto?



European Parliament elections: 6-9 June 2024



ENFORCEMENT OF RULES, ESPECIALLY ONLINE

□ Full enforcement of existing rules.

 Further Cooperation and alignment between MSAs and European Commission. An EU agency for enforcement should be considered.

More market surveillance cooperation projects between the industry and MSAs.

Revision of the Digital Services Act to address the liability for product compliance when there is no economic operator in the EU.







□ If **New Rules** are needed, they should be:

- evidence-based, simple, easy to understand and to be applied;
- based on socio-economic and environmental impact assessments;
- easy to enforce;
- attached to specific targets on market surveillance, and funding to MSAs.






SUSTAINABILITY OF LIGHTING PRODUCTS

- In the coming Ecodesign lighting regulation: the introduction of information requirements on lifetime of the key components of luminaires (light source and control gear).
- A sector-differentiated approach that is based on detailed socio-economic impact and application-specific risk assessments in regard to upcoming EU chemicals policy and legislation.





THE VALUE OF LIGHT

□ All EU legislation on buildings should:

- include requirements for a high indoor environmental quality, including better lighting,
- mandate automatic lighting control systems.
- Energy efficient, smart and connected streetlights in the objectives of **future Cohesion Funds.**
- Revise the Workplaces Directive to ensure a safe and comfortable environment.

An EU approach to address light at night.







- □ Less red tape and support to SMEs.
- An EU innovation agenda based on technology openness and innovative leadership.
- □ **Standards** and their harmonization.
- □ Skills development & transfer among generations.
