New LightingEurope Guidelines on EU Ecodesign & Energy Labelling

We have updated our popular guidelines on the EU Ecodesign and Energy Labelling Regulations to address many of the questions and requests for more information that we have received. We promised to inform you once an update is available –you can now download version 2 of our guidelines <u>here</u>.

The first versions of our Guidelines were published on 5 December 2019, the day of publication of Regulation (EU) No 2019/2020 on the ecodesign requirements for light sources and separate control gear and of Regulation (EU) No 2019/2015 on the energy labelling of light sources.

Since then, LightingEurope has received various questions and requests for more information, which are being answered in these second versions of the Guidelines. In addition, on 24 February 2020, the European Commission published a corrigendum for the ecodesign regulation with corrections to the legislative text of 5 December 2019. The changes brought by this corrigendum are also reflected in the second version of the ecodesign guidelines.

The LightingEurope guidelines are our contribution to support all companies to understand and apply the new and complex rules, and to help all authorities to enforce them. LightingEurope offers a range of guidelines, our members receive exclusive or early access to these.
